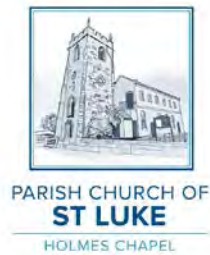


Praying Together @St Luke's, Holmes Chapel during Remembrance
